Scene:	Kids discover a box can lead to an unexpected adventure
Roles (6):	Narrator, Andy, Max, Jeanie, Dad
Ages:	7 years and over

The Box

Narrator: It was a rainy day. Andy and Max had their friend Jeanie over to play. They were going to go to the park today.

Dad: Sorry kids, it's too wet to go to the park today. You will have to play inside.

Max: (Whining) But dad, you promised we could go!

Jeanie: (cheerfully) It's okay Max. We can still have lots of fun playing inside.

Narrator: Max was not happy. He wanted to go on the swings today. He had plans and the rain ruined them.

The Box

Dad: We can try going to the park tomorrow. The weather should be better then.

Andy: Can we go to the zoo instead?

Max: (angrily) No! I want to go on the swings at the park. I have been waiting to go.

Dad: We can talk about it later. Maybe we can do both.

Narrator: Dad walked out of the room. Max crossed his arms and sat on the floor. He felt like his whole day was ruined

Jeanie: (excitedly) What game should we play Andy?

Max: (grumpily) We don't have any good games. All of our games are boring.

Narrator: Just then, Dad came back with a giant box. It was huge! Max's eyes got really wide.

The Box

Narrator: Max crawled into the box last. When he got inside, things changed! They were on a train, going at a fast speed.

Andy: (yelling) Hang on Max! (toots train horn) This train is part roller coaster.

Max: Woah! do you think we could slow down a little?

Narrator: Max held on to the seats inside the train. They were going so fast that he felt like he would fly out of the window.

Jeanie: (excitedly) Woo! This is amazing! Go faster, Andy!

The Box

Narrator: Max noticed that the train tracks led right into the ocean. Oh no!

Max: Guys! This train is going to crash into the ocean!

Jeanie: (worried) Oh no! Andy stop the train!

Andy: (fearful) I'm trying! I can't get it to stop!

Narrator: Max, Jeanie, and Andy held on tight as the train got closer to the ocean.

Max: Ahh! I can't look!

Narrator: Max shut his eyes just before they crashed into the water. But there was no crash!

Jeanie: (gasps) Guys! look!

Narrator: Max carefully opened one of his eyes.

Max: No! Let's get back in the box! I wanted some of that lemonade!
